And just when you thought it couldn't get any dreamier, here are nine brand-new luxury hotels to add your bucket list for when it's safe to travel again:

### Can Ferrereta, Mallorca, Spain. Opening spring 2021

If you thought the Spanish island of Mallorca was all sunburned tourists and budget high-rises, think again. Spaniards in the know come here for the unspoiled Mallorcan countryside, with its striking mountain scenery, organic orange groves and vineyards, and picturesque fishing villages. Now, the team behind the ultra-chic Sant Francesc Hotel Singular in Palma is opening a brand-new rural hideaway in the medieval village of Santanyi. Set in a 17th-century manor house, 32-room Can Ferrereta will feature one of the region's most exciting collections of contemporary art. It will also be home to a Mediterranean restaurant serving local, seasonal produce, two bars, an 80-foot swimming pool and a spa with a hammam and an indoor pool.

### One&Only Portonovi, Herceg Novi, Montenegro. Opening spring 2021

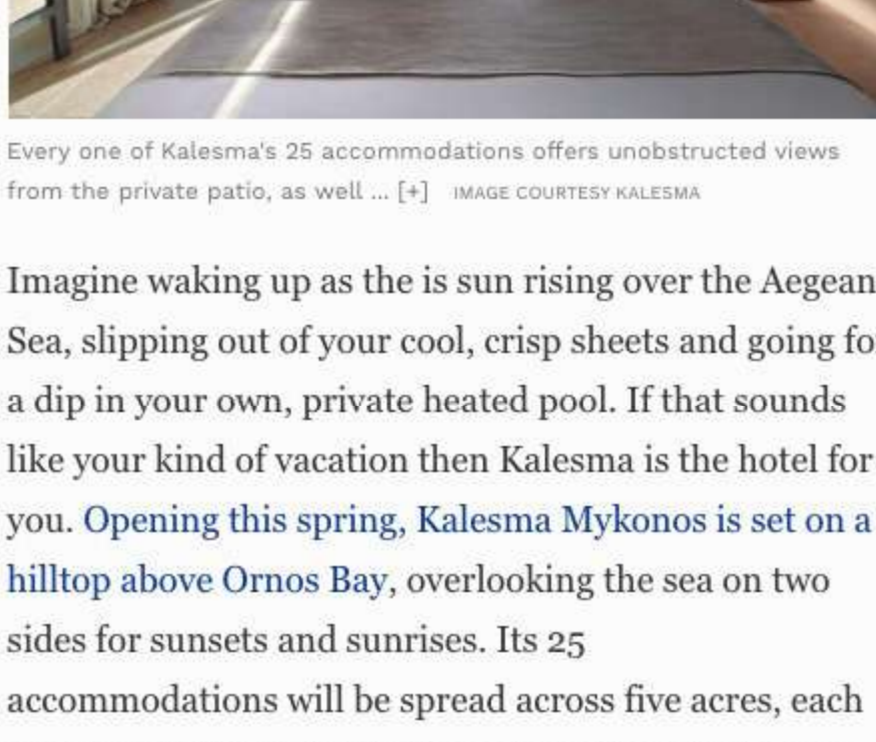

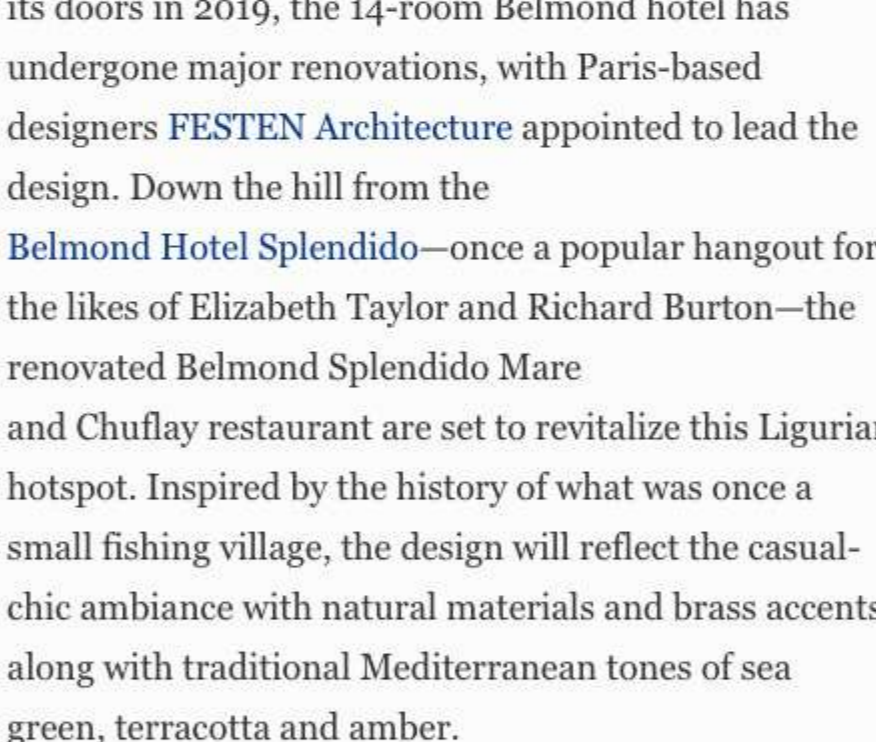
### Kalesma, Mykonos, Greece. Opening April 2021

Imagine waking up as the sun rises over the Aegean Sea, slipping out of your cool, crisp sheets and going for a dip in your own, private heated pool. If that sounds like your kind of vacation then Kalesma is the hotel for you. Opening this spring, Kalesma Mykonos is set on a hilltop above Ornos Bay, overlooking the sea on two sides for sunsets and sunrises. Its 25 accommodations will be spread across five acres, each offering unobstructed lookouts from the private patio, as well as a full-sized personal heated pool. The owners grew up on the island and want to introduce guests to the real Mykonos; not only the party scene, but also the local artists' studios, private beaches, and best shops. The design is traditional Cycladic—think whitewashed walls—but with a sleek modern twist, like the Rick Owens furniture in the lobby.

### Belmond Splendido Mare | Portofino, Italy. Opening April 2021

Perched on a hillside on the Italian Riviera, few hotels enjoy a more idyllic setting than the Belmond Splendido Mare in Portofino. Having closed its doors in 2019, the 14-room Belmond hotel has undergone major renovations, with Paris-based designers FESTEN Architecture appointed to lead the design. Down the hill from the Belmond Hotel Splendido—once a popular hangout for the likes of Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton—the renovated Belmond Splendido Mare and Chufly restaurant are set to revitalize this Ligurian hotspot. Inspired by the history of what was once a small fishing village, the design will reflect the casual-chic ambiance with natural materials and brass accents, along with traditional Mediterranean tones of sea green, terracotta and amber.

### OKU Ibiza, Ibiza, Spain. Opening spring 2021

This Spanish island may be best known as the white-hot clubbing capital of the Mediterranean, but it is also establishing itself as a popular wellness destination for the international jet set. Where better, then, for new "laidback luxury" lifestyle brand OKU Hotels to launch its collection of soulful five-star hideaways? Located on the fringe of Cala Graciosa bay, known for its delicate powder sand and pristine turquoise water, OKU Ibiza will feature the largest pool on the island, along with three additional swimming pools. With a focus on slower living, the hotel comprises 184 boho-chic rooms and suites, including the 1,500 square-foot OKU Signature Suite, a standalone four-bedroom villa with private pool, ocean-view penthouses, six swim-up rooms, two restaurants and an intimate spa.

### The Nai 3.3, Dugi Otok, Dalmatia, Croatia. Opening April 2021

Set on the picture-perfect Croatian island of Dugi Otok, The Nai 3.3 hotel is one of the most under-the-radar luxury hotel openings of the year, but that only adds to its appeal. This five-star organic farm will join the Leading Hotels of the World, with a unique concept based on being in continuous contact with nature. The Nai 3.3 hotel is set across almost ten acres of organic olive groves connected to the main building via a series of private terraces. The hotel comprises eight individually furnished and decorated units with terraces that provide a sense of total privacy and freedom, from which to enjoy the sunrise and gaze at the stars at night. The hotel features a 75-foot outdoor, saltwater infinity pool, a spa, two restaurants, and the opportunity for guests to sample the award-winning Nai 3.3 oil organic olive oil.

### Casa di Langa, Piedmont, Italy. Opening April 2021

As a keyhole to the Langhe region, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its cultural landscapes, Casa di Langa embraces tradition with a foot in the past, and an eye on the future. It is a testimony to wine growing and winemaking traditions, in a location celebrated for some of the world's finest wines, not to mention the renowned Alba white truffles.

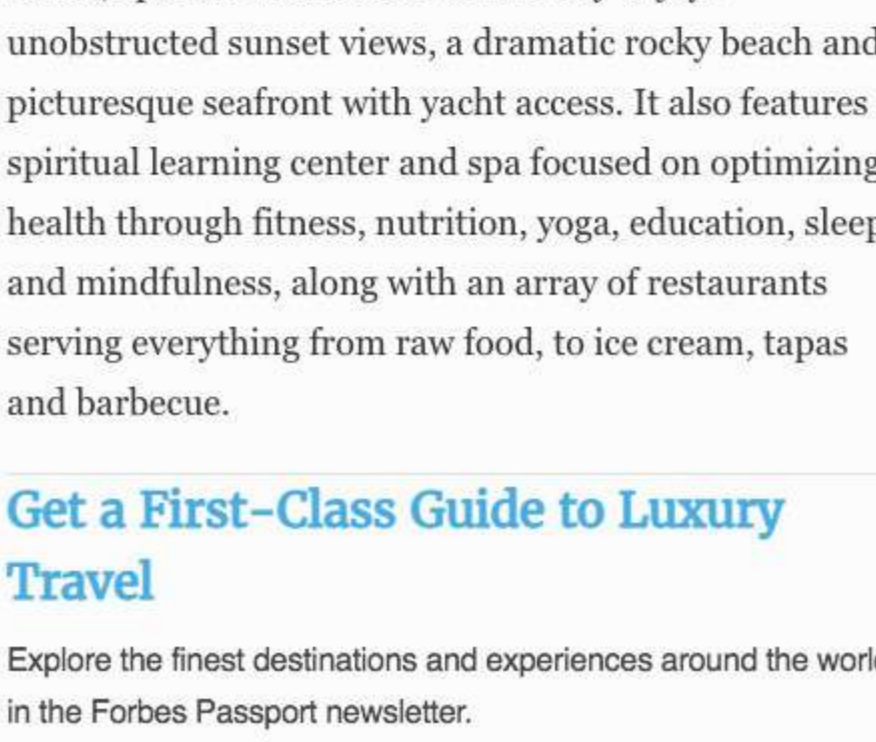
### Villa Igiea, Palermo, Sicily, Italy. Opening May 2021
